
# Sustainable Gardening Australia

## Our vision

A healthy, biodiverse planet and vibrant, sustainable communities.

# Our principal purpose

To encourage, educate and enable home and professional gardeners to adopt sustainable gardening practices to protect or enhance the natural environment or a significant aspect of it.

This year, SGA has continued to encourage low-impact gardening, water conservation, local healthy food production and building habitat and biodiversity. We have a team of scientists and work with experienced horticulturists to produce quality, evidence-based information which is communicated to people through avenues like Cuttings and Facebook.

Organisations such as SGA have a crucial role to play in the giant jigsaw puzzle that is going to construct a sustainable world for future generations and the millions of other species we share it with. We are totally committed to putting a few pieces of the jigsaw in place.

The SGA team has made great progress with the development of our programs, our planning and our organisational support systems. Together our paid staff, volunteers and pro bono support allows SGA to deliver way beyond what would be expected given our resources and budget.

We have been making real progress with the SGA Garden Product Guide—Safe for You 'n' Nature and ran a successful crowd funding campaign to raise money to help us move towards developing it into a web app.

Our training program in the form of Master Classes and Workshops caters for a range of gardeners and has grown in both the number of topics offered and attendance.

Significant increases in readership via the electronic (website, Facebook, Twitter and Instagram) also indicate the extension of the reach of our messages.





## Communication and Education

This has been a year of expansion and consolidation through both electronic media and face-to-face training. As climate change starts to make itself obvious and the environment becomes more polluted, there is more interest in growing food locally, minimizing environmental impacts and avoiding unwanted chemicals in gardens. This is being reflected in readership of our publications and in attendance at our training classes.

## Website

Readership of the website has again been increasing. There are now 348 articles on various aspects of gardening sustainably and 33 new topics have been addressed this year.

## **Cuttings Free Monthly Newsletter**

We have managed to publish Cuttings a few days earlier so that our readers have it just before a new month starts. It still provides a key route for readers to access our website articles. It also publicises events and training classes. As always, more writers would be welcome.

## YouTube

New videos have been published recording presentations from the Green Gardening Professional meetings.

## Social Media

Numbers of Facebook users and likes continues to increase. The relatively new Instagram account shows considerable increase even though our volunteer has little time to make posts.

## Garden Product Guide—Safe for You'n'Nature

The name of the Green Up Product Guide has been changed to make it convey more meaning and be more appealing to readers. A successful crowd funding campaign was started in May to pay the costs of developing it into a web app. The data is still being updated and work on its structure to increase user-friendliness is proceeding.

#### **Publications**

SGA has ceased work on hard copy publications because, given the pervasiveness of the internet, the need for them is declining. Nevertheless, there have been occasional enquiries for reprints and minor revisions.

## **Training**

Our training program, run by Richard Rowe, with a total attendance this year of 926, has increased its focus on delivering workshops in partnership with local government. Councils contract SGA to prepare and run these classes. Since SGA is not required to organise venues or run all promotion, this arrangement saves us time, allowing for more developmental work to be undertaken.

## **Master Classes**

Six Master Classes have been run with topics ranging from Habitat Gardening, Building Homes for Wildlife to Building Veggie Beds from Pallets.





## **Community Workshops**

Fourteen were conducted in partnership with local government for communities in their local area. SGA has developed a portfolio of 24 topics which are available for councils to choose from. As well as the above topics, this portfolio includes a number on sustainable design, food growing, recycling and gardening in small and temporary spaces.
